

An escalation in hostilities in the occupied Palestinian territory since April 2021 has caused many deaths and casualties.

Some of Gaza's health care buildings, facilities and essential infrastructure were damaged. Extensive damage to roads obstructs ambulance access and movement. Lack of electricity, high fuel costs, and the destruction of water and sanitation structures are placing strain on an already overwhelmed health system that is still responding to COVID-19.

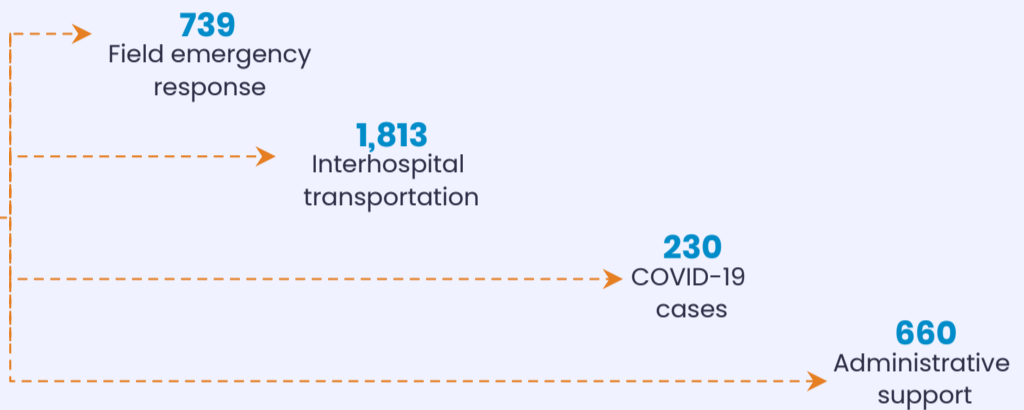

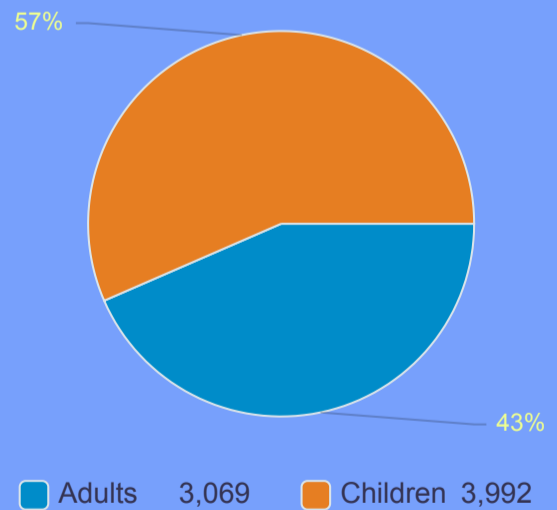
